

If anyone serves Me, let him follow Me; and where I am, there My servant will be also. If anyone serves Me, him My Father will honor. --John 12: 26--

In the early 1900s, a London newspaper printed an advertisement that read:

> Men wanted for hazardous darkness, and constant danger. Safe return doubtful. Honor and recognition in case of success.

Thousands of men from across England responded to this ad to be on a team headed by the famous arctic explorer, Sir Ernest Shackleton, Christian author, Warren W. Wiersbe, commented that if Jesus Christ had advertised for workers, His ad might have read:

> Men and women wanted for difficult task of helping to build My church. You will often be misunderstood, even by those working with you. You will face constant attack from an invisible enemy. You may not see the results of your labor, and your full reward will not come till after all your work is completed. It may cost you your home, your ambitions, even vour life.

Many Christians today determine the success of their spiritual lives based on the answers to questions like, "Is my message being accepted?" "Are people responding?" or, "Am I comfortable?" But the reality is that Jesus never said we'd have acceptance, recognition, or comfort in this life. Yet we must move forward in obedience. Maybe you've lived faithfully for years and have never seen the physical fruit of your labor. But don't worry. God recognizes your obedience and will reward you greatly. All you have to do is remain faithful! Have there been times when you stayed faithful and trusted God in obedience even when you didn't see the visible fruit of your work? Never give up!

A Page from Jim's Journal

This last week my family got to enjoy some time at Pointe West on the opposite side of Galveston Island. It was a great opportunity to relax and simply be together. Although I knew the week was going to be great, I was unable to fall asleep that first night. My heart was troubled. I was thinking about a student that was walking away from faith in Jesus. I had said and done everything I could and it was not enough. I was hurt for him. I walked out on the balcony and listened to the waves. It was late and everyone was asleep. I turned a small light on, opened up my bible and read Psalm 20 and 21. God has always been faithful to speak when I'm troubled and He never ceases to amaze me. Psalm 20 and 21 are two Psalms that go together and were written before and after a battle. Psalm 20 is a battle cry. The writer is declaring his trust in the Lord. Regardless of the circumstances, numbers, and odds the writer knows God is bigger. Psalm 21 is a declaration of praise in God for being stronger than the writer's enemies. There was one particular verse in each of these Psalms that gave me great comfort and put my heart at ease.

The first was Psalm 20:7. It says, "Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the Lord our God." It is an awesome act of faith to face down an opposing army and reduce their numbers and power to nothing in comparison to God in heaven. That particular verse gave me faith and reminded me (once again) that God is at work even when I cannot see it. The next verse that comforted me was Psalm 21:1-4. It reads, "O Lord, the King rejoices in your strength. How great is his joy in the victories you give! You have granted him the desire of his heart, and have not withheld the request of his lips. You welcomed him with rich blessings and placed a crown of pure gold on his head. He asked you for life, and you gave it to him - length of days, for ever and ever." This reminded me just how good God is to His children and He gives life to all who

I meditated on these two Psalms often while I was at the beach. They gave me comfort. We got back Saturday, right before celebrating our Seniors at church the next day. I went to bed early so I could be well rested for church and I woke up in the middle of the night because my phone had received a text. It was the student that I was hurting for earlier in the week. God is giving him a restless heart and he wants to talk. Our conversation has not taken place as of the writing of this article. But I recognize Gods hand at work. Work that does not depend on me, but invites me to be a part
