

## I've Been Thinking...

Dear Church Family,

In our last Compass issue, I shared with you how we will be making disciples by worship, transformational small groups, and by being on mission with Christ. I hope you are able to join us in our times of worship. Worship is right at the heart of all we are and all we do. Worship is about the only thing that I know for sure we will do forever. Getting a good start of that eternal activity is wise. It is going to take quite some time to implement small groups but in time that will come so I ask you all to be patient with our process.

However, being on mission with Christ is something that is building momentum for us. You have started to see quite a bit of emphasis around Operation Christmas Child. With this mission effort we will reach out to children in many parts of the world – sharing a box of joy and the gospel. Some of you contributed to the "Reach Texas" offering. We came close to our \$1000 goal. That money will help plant churches in Texas through the Southern Baptist Texas Convention. In addition to these, several of us had a chance to share our church and (more importantly) Christ with our community through the Butterfly Festival. Let me tell you just a bit about it.

The Butterfly Festival is an annual event in our community. Vendors and people meet for a day in the park. We were the only church with a booth. I'm so excited that we were able to do this. I don't know if anyone will come to Christ or to our church as a result of the Butterfly Festival. But we planted seed and we watered plants! Doing this is part of how we "Make Disciples!"


