A PAGE FROM JIM'S JOURNAL

This last week, Jaclyn and I participated in a Christmas party with other area student pastors and spouses. In typical youth ministry fashion, our Christmas party was anything but ordinary. It was actually a murder mystery party, and we had to take on the roles of characters that were assigned to us and figure out who the murderer was. The backstory that was given to us before we arrived read, "You have been invited on a **pleasure cruise** by Captain Michael Von Ammon. The guest list includes a number of the Captain's friends, family members, and business associates, as well as the crew of the Captain's sixty-foot yacht, the *Elizabeth May*. Everyone is expecting an evening cruise replete with dinner, drinks, and dancing - they aren't expecting foul weather, **the murder of someone on board**, or a sudden shipwreck on a deserted island in the uncharted Caribbean."

Jaclyn and I have never done anything like this, and we were both a little nervous. It turned out to be a fun night to remember! Jaclyn and I won the game and I even got voted "best actor" for my performance. We were both so glad to have gone and participated in such a wonderful night with partners in ministry. This whole experience reminded me of the importance of trying new things and experiences. That carries over to our relationship with God as well! It is so easy to stay in our lane and get in a routine where we only experience God in the ways we are most comfortable. Where do comfort and faith intersect? There is nothing comfortable about believing and living out in what we cannot see, yet the reward is life giving!

The author of Hebrews reflects on this in 11:32-34. He says, "And what more shall I say? I do not have time to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, and Jephthah, about David and Samuel and the prophets, who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, and gained what was promised; who shut the mouths of lions, quenched the fury of flames, and escaped the edge of the sword; whose weakness was turned to strength; and who became powerful in battle and routed foreign armies." Were any of these activities described within the comfort level of those who experienced them? I am comfortable saying no to that. It was their faith in God that gave them victory in these battles. Likewise, it is our faith in Christ that gives us victory in the most important battle. The battle for our souls. Romans 3:22 says, "Righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe."

I am thankful for the new experience and fun we had doing a murder mystery party. But I am ultimately more thankful for the new life I received, and the way God uses me when I step out in faith. I never want to grow too comfortable where I dictate the areas God cannot use me. Faith comes with a clearer vision of who Jesus is and that is the greatest adventure any of us could hope to experience.
