I've Been Thinking...

Dear Church Family,

On Sunday mornings (and in my Compass articles), I am beginning to trace out the outlines of our strategy for moving forward in the making of disciples. There is nothing new in the matters that I am sharing. In fact, I just went back looking at old sermons that I have preached here and just about every idea that I am drilling into now has already been talked about.

We know God would have us "make disciples," and we know a disciple (in the fullest sense) is one who is a mature reproducing follower of Christ. So, our question is – "how do we make one?" In some ways the answer is complex. In other ways, it's quite simple. We plan to have a primary three-part process. We plan to worship the majestic God. We plan to be in small groups where life change happens best. We plan to be on mission with Christ. That's it. So, yes that is simple, but I believe it is also profound.

Many months ago, we explored the idea of worship. We found some important truths about worship especially as we looked at the story of the woman at the well (John 4). Our clearest learnings from that passage concerned worship as needing to be in spirit and in truth. (YouTube February 7, 2021) Worship in spirit and truth is not a surprise to you; but have you ever thought about how worship is a necessary part of being a disciple? If we are going to follow Christ, we must be people of worship. I know this is true and that is why as we move into our strategy of making disciples the first step in our process is and will always be – worship.

Worship is the only thing (I guess) that believers will do forever. It is a major occupation of heaven. It must be a major occupation of earth as well. Therefore, as we make disciples in our church, we ourselves will worship God, and we will invite the community around us to come and worship Him with us. More about this Sunday.

Yet for every excuse or limitation that's given as a reason for God's inability to use a person, God reminds us that it's not by our might or by our power that He accomplishes His purposes—it's by His Spirit. Do you have a hindrance? Are you limited in some way? Give it to the Lord. No problem is too big or too small for Him. He will make everything "work together for good" if you turn to Him and trust in His power!

All things work for our good Though sometimes we don't see how they could. Struggles that break our hearts in two sometimes blind us to the truth. God is too wise to be mistaken, God is too good to be unkind. So when you don't understand, when don't see His plan, When you can't trace His hand trust His heart.
