

I've Been Thinking...

Dear Church Family,

I lost a friend and a brother last week. On Monday, while I was still visiting with my family in North Carolina, Edward Campbell was hit by a car early in the morning north of Jasper on Highway 96. I want you to know some of his story.

Several months ago, Oddie Powell, pastor of Rayburn Baptist church, shared information about a need at a trailer park on Highway 96. Some of us from the church visited the trailer park and found that we could help them with a small need they had. It was a small contact, but it led to an encounter with Edward by some of our members. They invited Edward to church. Several weeks later he showed up on a cold Sunday morning, having ridden his bike from the trailer park to the church. Not only did he show up, but at the end of the service he responded to the invitation telling me, "I want to trust Him (meaning Jesus)." He and I prayed together, and Edward reached out to the God who saves those who "trust" Him.

That next week I spent some time with Edward helping him to understand more about what it means to follow Christ. We talked about being a disciple and about experiencing life change. Edward told me about his life and about his desire to follow Jesus and to share Jesus at his trailer park. Many of you will remember when Edward came forward again in the invitation asking to be baptized and to join our family of faith. There was great joy all over the house on that Sunday. Edward was going to be baptized on March 6. That will not happen now. But Edward is in heaven. Baptism does not save a person. It is an important step in obedience, but it is not salvific.

The Sunday I left for North Carolina Edward said this to me, "I think I have found a church that I can love." When He said that I thought, "and you have found a church that will love vou." EVERY LIFE IN JASPER TRANS-FORMED BY CHRIST... There are hundreds of people like Edward in our community. Let's bring them in to Christ and to a church that will love them.

Perspective changes everything about the way you think. Jaclyn and I were in Las Vegas last week, celebrating 15 years of being married, when Russia decided to cross the border and begin their attack on Ukraine. We were on vacation, but I was burdened by what was unfolding while we were there. I caught myself several times thinking "I wish there was something I could do at this moment other than just pray." Then it would hit me. "JUST PRAY?!?! Did I really just minimize the power of prayer in my thoughts?" Unfortunately, I did.

What I see with my eyes so often conflicts with what I know about God. But when we went to Red Rocks Canyon one morning during our stay my perspective changed. Pictured below is what I stared at when Psalm 19 came flooding into my mind. Verse 1 says, "The heavens declare the glory of God, the skies proclaim the marvelous work of His hands." An entire ser-

mon was preached directly at me. But it didn't even come from someone's mouth. It came from the skyline above the mountains, reminding me
