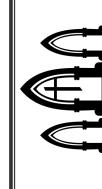

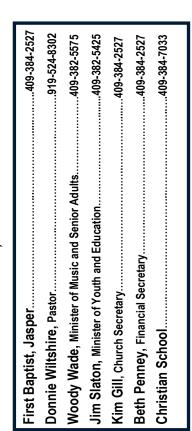

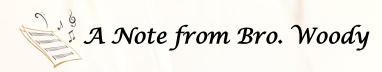

What you read impacts you. Think about how you feel when you read your news feed. Reading the Bible on a regular and consistent basis has several benefits. First, the Bible shows us God's character and provides us God's revelation of Himself to His people. In each section of the Bible, we see God's holy, unchanging, faithful, gracious and loving character. Second, 2 Timothy 3:16–17 when discussing the topic of Scripture says that it is "beneficial for teaching, for rebuke, for correction, for training in righteousness." The next verse goes on to say that this leads to the completeness and equipping "for every good work." Third, regularly reading God's word reorients our thinking so that we can grow in maturity, which is part of the Christian calling. Have you ever met a mature Christian who did not regularly read the Bible? These three things are really just the beginning. This list could include dozens of reasons why you should read the Bible on a regular basis. Reading the Bible is a spiritual discipline, which means that we need to be disciplined in how we approach it. If you lack the desire to read the Bible, pray and ask that God would give
