But we are thinking and praying and searching for God's clear directions.

In the next couple weeks, a letter will go out from the missions committee to the whole church. That letter will explain more about this great step of faith. That letter will invite you into the process of finding God's direction. Would you pray now for God's leadership?



Jaclyn and I are just coming off of a camping trip to Fredericksburg with all of our kids. We stayed at a Jellystone RV and Camping Resort just 8 or 9 miles East of town and tent camped all week. We made so many fun memories. One of my absolute favorites is something that God laid on my heart after hiking the summit trail at Enchanted Rock.

Enchanted Rock is just one massive dome. The way up is nothing but rock. There is no soil for life to grow, and no place for water to rest. It would be a harsh environment for any form of life. So it was a complete shock to get to the very top and see water! In the midst of the watered areas there were cactus, patches of tall grass, and even flowers. If

you looked real close you could even see signs of animal life in these shallow pools of water. These vernal pools are home to thousands of fairy shrimp. Feel free to google it. That's what I had to do. I was amazed that life was flourishing in such a harsh environment. God gave just the right conditions on top of this barren rock for multiple life forms to thrive and show off His glory.

This picture immediately brought to mind the parable of the sower from Matthew 13. This is the story of how a sower went and sowed different types of seed. Jesus describes the seed falling on four different environments. Of the four, only one was suitable for growing and was able to produce much fruit. At first glance, I

would have never thought the top of Enchanted Rock was suitable for life. But it's only those specific areas on the rock that could hold water and gathered just enough soil.

The parable in Matthew 13 and this picture God gave me while hiking begged the question, "which soil do I identify the most with right now?" Am I receiving what God is speaking to me? Am I accepting His word into my heart? Or is it like the seed scattered on the path, or the seed sown among the thorns? A lot of times I blame the outside environment for times of lackluster faith, but the true problem is the human heart. God can make live thrive in the harshest of conditions.
