

We want to see men and women and young people trust Christ and grow in Him. Well, what can we do to accomplish this vision? How can we be innovative in our task to be on mission with Christ?

I don't know about you, but I would have a bit of a hard time finding ways to spend \$150,000. The great author C. S. Lewis (you've probably heard of him!) once wrote on the subject of pain:

"We can rest contentedly in our sins and in our stupidities, and everyone who has watched gluttons shoveling down the most exquisite foods as if they did not know what they were eating, will admit that we can ignore even pleasure. But pain insists upon being attended to. God whispers to us in our pleasures, speaks in our consciences, but shouts in our pains. It is his megaphone to rouse a deaf world."

So often, Christians experience pain on seemingly unbearable levels. Yet what keeps them going, through the hard times and trials of life, is the fact that God is in control. In fact, God is so in control that He often will appoint suffering to His people to help them strengthen their dependence on Him. Yet unfortunately today, much of the Christian message has been distorted, with many preachers of the Word proclaiming that God only wants us to be healthy, wealthy, and successful. This is a dangerous message not only because it isn't biblical, but because it directly contradicts the experiences of so many faithful followers of Christ. Pain is real! And it comes in many forms. But in Christ, you have the hope that it's only temporary. So, if you're suffering today, in whatever way suffering comes, deepen your dependence on God and remember that there will come a day when all pain will end and you'll be with the Lord forever! Ask God to give you the strength to persevere through pain and fully rely on Him through the hard times.

#### A Page from Jim's Journal

This last Sunday evening the students went to Caradine Park to play Pickleball. We divided up into teams of two and worked up the rules of our little tournament. Not long after we started playing, we noticed two little boys watching us through the fence. I went over and spoke with them, and they told me they love to play pickleball. They ran to their house, which was right across the street from where we were and came back a minute later with their own pickleball paddles.

They were eager to jump into the action and ran right into the middle of the court where one of the games was currently being played. The younger of the two boys ended up getting hit in the back with the ball as he ran onto the court. It didn't daze him one bit though as he continued onto the other court where another game was being played. These boys really wanted someone to play with. I watched as our students, without being told, took time out of playing with each other and would play with these two boys. I got a glimpse of the work God was doing in the hearts of our students. They were so selfless to take time away from each other to make sure these boys felt special and loved. It reminded me of a verse the College and Career Sunday School Class discussed during church that morning. James 1:27 says, "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit widows and orphans in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world." Orphans and widows, in James' context, were an especially needy segment of the church. Since most were unable to reciprocate in any way, caring for them demonstrated true, sacrificial, Christian love. I'm not trying to suggest these boys were orphans, or that they were even in great physical need. But it was obvious they had great emotional and spiritual need, and I was so blessed to be able to watch our stu-

dents as they met those needs.

God is doing a great work in the life of our students, and I am so thankful to have a front row seat to the action!
