I've Been Thinking...

Dear Church Family,

If you happen to read a book about making disciples, you will almost certainly find that all the disciple making books talk about small groups. Many of you have been a part of a small group in a church before. I have. When I moved to New Orleans in 1978, I was the pastor of a mission church. Irma and I worked hard to plant that young church. We poured ourselves out and needed something that would pour back into us. Together with a few friends we formed a group that met in our homes once a week. We studied the Bible and prayed together. The group only stayed together for about a year, but it was very helpful for us.

Years later, a dear friend in Raleigh, North Carolina who was in our Sunday School class, wanted to start a home Bible group. After planning for some time, several of us launched our home group. This group lasted for many years and over those years it provided me with my richest spiritual experiences. This small group is where I grew as a Christ follower. That is the reason many churches today have small groups meeting weekly (or close to weekly) in homes. A small group (like the ones I have experienced) provides a place where Christians can grow as disciples. The right kind of small group creates an environment where people can share their lives, become vulnerable to the work of the Holy Spirit, and can foster a level of accountability to live the Christ life. In addition to these, small groups become a way that new people can come to know Christ.

Small groups form part of our strategy to fulfill our vision (to see every life in Jasper transformed by Christ . . .) That is why we are moving toward a small group launch in October of this year. We will start small, but we will grow. We are launching with four groups. These groups will meet at different times of the week and in different locations around our city. Very soon you will hear more about these groups. What I am asking you to do now is to pray about your participation.

Coming soon. . .I can hardly wait.

But you can exchange that anger and fear for joy when you learn to pray like Jesus, and trust in God's will over your own. The truth is God's in complete control, even when you can't make sense of what's going on. He loves you – and if you'll trust Him in all things - you'll experience the peace of His presence like never before! So today, ask God to help you desire His will in your life over your own.

All things work for our good though sometimes we can't see how they could. Struggles that break our hearts in two sometimes blind us to the truth. Our Father knows what's best for us, His ways are not our own. So when your pathway grows dim and you just can't see Him, Remember you're never alone. God is too wise to be mistaken; God is too good to be unkind. So when you don't understand, when don't see His plan, When you can't trace His hand trust His heart.
