



## I've Been Thinking...

Dear Church Family,


I suspect you have seen the words, "on mission with Christ." Have you thought about what that might mean? Especially, have you thought about what that might mean in your life? Jesus was quite clear about His mission - He came into the world "to seek and to save the lost." (Luke 19:10, Matthew 18:11, John 3:17, 1 Timothy 1:15) To say it another way, He entered the world knowing that He would go to the cross to provide salvation for all who would believe. That was His mission. So, what does it look like when we are "on mission with Christ?"


It is my opinion that at FBC we are seeing us start to live into that part of our vision that calls on us to be, "on mission with Christ." Here's what I see: (1) back on October 1 about two dozen of us staffed a booth at the Butterfly Festival inviting our community to join us at FBC, (2) on October 26 we hosted several hundred "Jasperites" at our FallFest and made them feel loved and welcomed at FBC, (3) we are in the middle of recruiting, organizing, and training a 12 member team to do a mission trip to India March 26 - April 6, (4) we have a team of guys who are remodeling a dorm room at East Texas Baptist Encampment so more kids can attend camp this next summer (we're going to spend \$12,000 on this project), (5) our church just packed 700+ Operation Christmas Child shoe boxes to take the gospel around the world, (6) and yesterday our mission committee set our Lottie Moon Christmas offering (LMCO) goal at \$9500. This is what we have done in the past two months - on mission with Christ.

I recently learned that 2021-2022 saw the largest LMCO that Southern Baptists have ever given. The offering last year was 203.7 million dollars. That was a 14.7% increase over the previous year. This allowed Southern Baptists to put 3,650 missionaries on the field and support them. Praise God for this. And Praise God for how we as a Family of Faith are living into our vision to be "On Mission With Christ!"

More to come...I can hardly wait!
