






I've Been Thinking...

Dear Church Family,

I have a very interesting copy of the Bible on my desk. It is a facsimile of the New Testament translated and published by William Tyndale in 1526. It is very hard to read because it is in an early 16th century font and the spelling is in the English of Shakespeare. Of the 3000 to 6000 copies that were printed of this edition of the New Testament, only three are known to exist today. The facsimile I have is made from one of those three. It is a remarkable book to try to read.

What is so amazing about the Tyndale New Testament is that it was the first English Bible made as a translation of the Greek New Testament. The Wycliffe Bible made in the 14th century was a translation of the Latin Vulgate. Tyndale intended for his New Testament to reflect the original New Testament language (Greek) and to be an inexpensive copy, available for every English speaker. Almost every English Bible since Tyndale has depended in someway on the Tyndale translation.

We don't use the Tyndale New Testament anymore. We do, however, use a great variety of translations in our church family. Many of us use and love the King James Version or the New KJV. Some of you, like me, use versions like the New American Standard Bible or the New International Version or even the version Southern Baptists produced, the Christian Standard Bible. There is not enough space in this article for me to explain the differences between these various versions or to give you my thoughts about them. (Come Sunday evening for the Bible app study for more info.)

Here is the great truth, though, that I want you to hold to firmly – any faithful translation is still the word of God. The book that God inspired and gave to His people (even in translation) still leads us to truth, salvation, and the will of God. That is why we give so much attention to the Bible here at FBC. We read it. We study it. We preach from it. We labor over the words and the grammar because this book, uniquely, is God's love letter to the world. Come Sunday and let's pour over it together.

I can hardly wait. . .


On his 75th birthday, Douglas MacArthur wrote...
