





#### I've Been Thinking...

Dear Church Family,

I remember some years ago seeing a painting of the manger scene. It had most of the usual parts: barn, hay, manger, animals, baby Jesus in the manger. But there was something unusual about the picture. One could imagine that off to the side, out of the picture, there was a window allowing moonlight to stream into the barn. The window must have had grilles or muntins, because as the light of the moon passed through the window it created a shadow in the shape of a cross that fell right across the manager in which Jesus lay. It took a moment for me (back then) to take in the meaning of that simple picture but after thinking it hit me - over the manger bed there was already the shadow of a cross!

The stories are tightly intertwined - the birth story and the cross story. It may seem odd but the two do not make sense unless taken together. The birth story tells us how God came into the world. It gives us insight into the God/man nature of Jesus. The cross story tells us WHY Jesus came into the world. It gives us the purpose that God had in becoming one of us.

In the previous Compass, we took a look at "being on mission with Christ." I was (and still am) quite excited about how we as a church are moving deeper and deeper into this key aspect of our vision at FBC Jasper. "To see every life in Jasper transformed by Christ . . ." It will be mandatory, if we are to see our vision happen, that we align ourselves with the mission that Jesus had in the world. He came for nothing less than to transform the nature of humankind. And He does that through His life, His death, His resurrection, and His continued presence in the world in His people (in the power of the Holy Spirit) making disciples of all the nations. Our work starts at home. But it touches the world.


Isn't it exciting to be "on mission with Christ?"! -Yes, it is!


