

# I've Been Thinking...

Dear Church Family,

I have a history of looking back and looking forward. In both the 2022 and 2021 January Compass, I wrote a "look back. . .look forward" article. Seems good to me to do this again.

We believe that God has set us on a path to "see every life in Jasper (city and county) transformed by Christ. . " One small way to see how we are living into that vision is to see how many new members have come to join us in this task. In 2022, 32 people joined this family of faith. Ten of those by profession of faith and baptism. Of course, we have a long way to go but we are on the path.

We believe that God would have us worship Him in Spirit and in truth. This year our sanctuary has begun to refill (after Covid) and the Spirit in the room is palpable. The music lifts us up and God's word fills us up and sends us out - Sunday after Sunday. We believe that God would have us share life in biblical "koinonia." A significant part of this "life sharing" happens in small groups meeting in homes. This is new to us and as of this week there are somewhat over 40 people who have joined a small group. We believe that God would have us be on mission with Christ. Being on mission with Christ is how we take the gospel and the love of Christ to our community and beyond. I would like to share with you some ways we have done this. In 2022 we gave: \$58,582.30 through the Southern Baptist Cooperative Program, \$14,644.95 through our local Baptist Association, \$10,936.98 to Lottie Moon Christmas Offering, \$7,269.66 to Annie Armstrong Home Mission Offering; we sent 722 boxes around the world through Operation Christmas Child; we remodeled one dorm at ETBE and are remodeling another one right now; we sent our youth to M-Fudge; participated in three community events to promote Christ and our church; shared Christ with our Christian school children and families; and made plans to send mission teams in 2023 to India and Puerto Rico.

God is at work among us. The above is only a taste of that fact. As we surrender to our King in 2023, "greater works than these (John 20:12)" we will do because the living God is among us!

I can hardly wait. . .

## A PAGE FROM JIM'S JOURNAL




