

### I've Been Thinking...

Dear Church Family,

I hope many of you have been able to be with us in worship recently as we have tried to come to a biblical understanding of who Baptist people are and where we come from. I have enjoyed sharing with you how we are Christians (part of over 2 billion in the world) but we are also Protestant Christians who agree with Protestants on the centrality of scripture, salvation by faith, and the priesthood of the believer.

But Baptists also have much that is somewhat distinctive to us. We think the church is comprised only of believers and that necessitates abandoning infant baptism. Further on baptism, be believe the scriptural mode of baptism is by immersion. Finally, we believe that the competency of the individual (Soul Competency) manifests itself in a separation of church and state and an autonomous church body making decision as a democracy (under God of course).

Unlike most every other church you know (except for independents) we have no church authority over us. We have no Bishop. We have no Conference. We have no board of elders. We have no magistrate. As a congregation of believers who have individual "soul liberty" we have a church that bows to no one but Jesus.

However, that does not mean we don't cooperate with other believers. We cooperate in every way we can to demonstrate our Christian togetherness. We especially cooperate with like minded evangelicals who share our conviction about conversion and disciple making. When it comes to our particular denomination, Southern Baptists, we cooperate in major ways. We share a denominational history that goes back to 1845. We share mission efforts that go back to that same year.

In 1925 we made two big steps in our cooperation. We adopted a confession of faith that we call, "The Baptist Faith and Message." We also adopted a way to pay for the work we do. That way is called, "The Cooperative Program." Last year we gave \$58,582.50 through the Cooperative Program to fund our cooperative work. I look forward to telling you what all that money did!

I can hardly wait . . .


