

I've Been Thinking...

Dear Church Family,

I am writing this Compass article from Israel. As you know several people from our church have gone to Israel (and a few days in Egypt) and have brought along with us several more people from Troy Knight's church in North Carolina. As you can imagine we have had a most wonderful time. We are halfway through our trip, and we are confident that the second half will be as good or better than the first half.

As I write these words I'm looking down at my tired and swollen feet. We have walked miles every day and climbed more stairs than any of us can count. But that's the price we've had to pay to experience the great blessings we have had. The blessings are too many to list here but let me tell you three. First, we sat within a stone's throw of Peter's house in Capernaum and read the story of the paralytic lowered through the roof - "Son, your sins are forgiven," Jesus said. On a hillside near where Jesus delivered the sermon on the Mount we read the Beatitudes - "Blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." And today sitting on the Mount of olives in the garden of Gethsemane right beside the Church of All Nations, (surrounded by thousand-year-old olive trees), we read this prayer of Jesus, "not my will but thine be done."

Oh well, here's one more: today we saw the most probable location for the resurrection. There are two competing places. One is the Church of the Holy Sepulcher the other is the Garden Tomb. Most scholars agree that the Church is the place. The fact is we don't need to find the place. Wherever you look the tomb is empty. We are tired but that's nothing. He died and rose and that's everything.

Instead, let's live in the freedom that Christ has bought us! Let's pray and ask God to help us understand the freedom we have in Christ. Then, as we grow in our freedom, we can shake off the yoke of guilt and experience the joy we're meant to have!
