

# I've Been Thinking...

Dear Church Family,


Do you remember when you were saved? My memory of the exact day is a bit unclear. I was a fairly young boy, and I made my decision for Christ in my home. My mother and father were devout believers, so we learned about Jesus at church, and we learned about Jesus even more at home. I heard Bible stories at home, and I saw my family pray frequently. In families like ours it is not unusual to see children making decisions for Christ at a young age. What I do remember quite clearly is making my public decision to follow Christ. I remember holding tightly to the pew in front of me and not having the courage to respond to the invitation on Sunday morning. But on Sunday night God gave me the courage that I lacked, and I walked the aisle professing Christ as my savior and Lord. A few weeks later I was baptized in the Highland Avenue Baptist Church in National City, California. That was in 1959; about 64 years ago.

I have never regretted that decision to follow Christ. In fact, I will confess to you today that everything good that has ever come into my life has come to me as a result of that decision. I think about the kind of life I lived as a boy. I was not perfect, but I was surrounded by Christian friends who encouraged my faith walk. My education and my career path were all blessings from God. My best friend and partner in life, Irma, came into my life by God's hand. The places I have lived and the churches I have served have been because of Jesus. I have lived a life of adventure traveling to dozens of countries and serving on a great many mission teams. I would count my retirement from the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina and my serving the First Baptist Church of Jasper, Texas as pastor as an "extra scoop" of God's gracious provision.

Let me tell you straight out - trusting Jesus and following Jesus has been glorious. If you don't quite understand the "epic journey" nature of the "Christ life" that I have described, would you join us in worship this Sunday and let me (and us) tell you about it.

Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you at the proper time, casting all your anxiety on Him, because He cares for you. -- 1 Peter 5:6-7--

In the 17th century, German pastor Paul Gerhardt and his family were forced to flee their home during the Thirty Years War. One night as they stayed in a small village inn, homeless and afraid, his wife broke down crying. Then, Gerhardt too went out in the garden and wept himself. At that time, he felt the Lord's presence anew. Taking his pen, he wrote the famous hymn, "Give to the Winds Thy Fears" that has since given comfort to many. The hymn begins,

Give to the winds thy fears, hope and be undismayed. God hears thy sighs and counts thy tears, God shall lift up thy head. Through waves and clouds and storms, He gently clears thy way: Wait thou His time; so shall this night soon end in joyous day.

That night, Gerhardt was impressed with a real and living truth: God often makes His presence known most clearly in our darkest hours. He uses our pain and our sorrow to show us that He is our only source of strength.

Maybe today, you are facing a trial of loneliness or pain a trial that maybe you think is hopeless. But put yourself in God's hands. Wait for His timing, and trust that at the end of your night will come a joyous day! So, today, pray and tell God your worries, fears, and cares. Entrust them to Him and wait for His perfect plan to unfold.

I've had many tears and sorrows, I've had auestions for tomorrow. There's been times I didn't know right from wrong. But in every situation God gave me blessed consolation That my trials come to only make me strong. Through it all, through it all, I've learned to trust in Jesus, I've learned to trust in God; Through it all, through it all, I've learned to depend upon His Word.


## A Page from Jim's Journal

Come alongside them and show them how to do the jobs that you normally do. It is a gift to have eager hearts for service. I know that we will take this gift and nurture it so that they may continue to grow in their desire to serve. It is my prayer and desire that the church gets to know our teenagers like I have been able to, and with that, being able to see the work God is doing in their life and worship Him as a result.


