

I've Been Thinking...

Dear Church Family,


On more than one occasion I have mentioned the epic journey that mom, dad, a friend, and I took in 1971. The four of us made a two-month trip driving from Corpus Christi, Texas, to Fairbanks, Alaska. It was a long-distance trip covering an average of about 350 miles each day. What made it "epic" for us was its distance. I've never made a road trip since that came close to that two-month mileage. But it was also epic because of the wide range of experiences we had along the way. Along the way when we could we stopped to see old friends. Also, along the way we made many new friends. We saw the glories of the Rocky Mountains, the Tetons, the amazing Yellowstone National Park and the towering Denali, tallest mountain in North America. One night in Yellowstone I rode my motorcycle from the Mammoth Hot Springs camping area to the Fishing Bridge RV park. It took a couple hours in the frozen darkness. Almost the coldest I've ever been in my life. Soaking in the Liard Hot Springs on the Alaskan Highway (water temp 126+ degrees) was about the hottest I've been in my life. We had unimaginable thrills and hours of pure boredom. A couple times I feared for my life but much of the time I felt more alive than I ever had before. That is the nature of an "epic" journey.

On Sunday mornings we are following the journey of Abram (who will soon become Abraham). His geographic journey went from Ur at the mouth of the Tigris/ Euphrates River all the way to Egypt. 4000 years ago, that was an unimaginable distance. But the bigger journey was his spiritual journey. Spiritually he moved from paganism to total fidelity to Yahweh, the God who called him. He had every imaginable experience along the way. He fought battles. He witnessed disaster. He made terrible mistakes. He entered into a saving relationship with the One True God by faith and became the father of all who would believe. But here's the point of this whole article – are you on your own "epic" journey of life IN CHRIST?

So many people live their Christian life as though it were a "side gig," something they do when they are not otherwise occupied. Oh, what they miss. God wants to take your life, our lives, and form them into the "image of His son" (Romans 8:29). That is what God was doing to Abram. That is what He wants to do to you!
