





### I've Been Thinking...

Dear Church Family,

If shared with you in the last issue of the "Compass" that I will be preaching on Sunday mornings for some time from the Book of Acts. The early chapters of Acts trace the birth and development of the church, and we have much to learn from following that story. We have seen the commission of Jesus, the beginning of a Spirit empowered people (the church), and the results of spending time with Jesus. That will bring us to the end of chapter 4 and the beginning of chapter 5 which we will look at this Sunday as we think about "Transformation and Deception."

I hope you have noticed the message that the followers of Jesus proclaimed. As we move through the Book of Acts the message becomes more and more uniform. It actually has five or six quite distinguishable pieces. Here they are: The Old Testament announced the life of Jesus; Jesus lived and taught publicly so His life was no surprise; He was killed on a Roman cross; God raised Him from the dead; the followers of Jesus are witnesses of these matters. You will find this message in (what we have seen so far): Acts 2:14-36, 3:12-26, and 4:8-12. You will also find the same message throughout most of the Book of Acts.

A study like this gives us an opportunity to lay our lives and the life of our church beside the lives of the early believers and the life of the early church and see how we are doing. I am convinced that we have a pretty decent understanding of the commission we have from Christ. I think theologically we believe that we are empowered by the Holy Spirit. What concerns me though is we do not seem to exercise that power in our daily lives and in the ongoing life of our church. Consequently, our lives tend to "miss the mark" when it comes to demonstrating the effect of Christ in us. Would you determine to join us on Sunday mornings as we discover what we can do to change this reality? I can just imagine what might happen if you did.

A man lay seasick in his bunk one stormy night, during a long trip across the Atlantic. He could hardly move from the severe discomfort. All of a sudden, he heard a cry of "Man overboard!" from the deck above. His first thought was, God help that poor fellow. There's nothing I can do in the state I am in. Then the thought struck him. There is something I can do. So he took his lantern and held it up to the porthole next to his bunk. The drowning man was rescued, and the next day he reported, "I was going down in the darkness when someone put a light in a porthole. It shone on my hand and a sailor in a lifeboat grabbed my hand and pulled me in."

"I'm too sick..." "I'm too weak..." "I'm too old ..." "There is nothing I can do to help..." Often, we use excuses like these and fail to make a difference in the kingdom of God. We only see our weaknesses and never take initiative to do what we can. But weakness is no excuse for not putting forth all of the strength we have for God's purposes. And the truth is it's in our weakness that God's power is often shown the strongest. So whatever situation you may be in today, put forth the effort to share Christ and watch how God will use your weakness for His glory! And pray that God would open your eyes to the ministry opportunities He's placed around you – even when you face tough challenges.
