

#### I've Been Thinking...

Dear Church Family,

On January 7 I started a series of sermons from the book of Acts and each Sunday morning, we have moved chapter by chapter through those early acts of the Holy Spirit. It's a bit surprising how long it takes to move through half of a book in the Bible but that is where we are at this point. We are just about to finish the first 15 chapters of this early history of the Christian movement. I hope you have been able to be with us through this study.

When I started this series, I told you that I hoped we could learn lessons from the early church that would help us in the life of our church. Some sermons have been more on this point than others but all of them have tried to help our understanding of church life and help our commitment to be the church that Christ wants us to be. Has that happened? I hope so. I hope some of us have caught the lessons of Acts. To help us solidify the learnings that were in the text I plan to do some "wrap-up" sermons from Acts. I know that summer is coming and that all of us will be traveling and taking vacation and spending time with family. I would like to ask that when you are in town do your best to join us as we try to nail down timeless truths for the Church and for our church.

This Sunday we are at the end of the Jerusalem Council. The Jerusalem Council clarified for all time how a person is saved. Everyone who has ever been born again has come to God by His grace through faith. You do not earn salvation – it is God's gift. But the Council also spoke to the obligation of love that Christians have toward each other. That is the topic we will explore this Sunday. The gospel never changes but the concessions we make to each other due to culture differences bend and turn. Just how do we live this Christian life? Well, that's a good question. Why don't you come and see!

### A Note from Bro. Woody

"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall Love your NEIGHBOR and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies

and pray for those who persecute you."

--Matthew 5: 43-44--

Corrie Ten Boom in her book, <u>Reflections of God's Glory</u>, shared the story of a Christian man she met in Africa who had bandaged hands. She asked him how he was injured, and he said, "My neighbor's straw roof was on fire; I helped him to put it out." Later, Corrie heard the rest of the story. The neighbor hated this man and set his roof on fire while he, his wife, and his children were asleep inside. Fortunately, he was able to put out the fire in his house. But sparks flew over to the neighbor's roof and set it ablaze. So, this man did everything he could to help his neighbor put out the fire in his house – and that's how his hands were burned.

Christ's call to "love your enemies" isn't one that's easy. But when love that surpasses all understanding is shown to those who deserve it least, God does some miraculous things. So, love your enemies even when it's hard. You can't do it on your own, but God will help you when you need it! Ask God to help you love your enemies – even when you don't want to. Ask God to help you see people the way He sees them.
