

Lately, I've been deeply convicted about the enemy's relentless efforts to divide us in every way possible. Satan seeks to break up families, divide the church, and turn our hearts away from Jesus. Christian School Ministry Team

We have created a new ministry team that will be called the FBC Christian School Ministry Team. This team will lead us as we seek to impact the spiritual lives of the children and the families connected to our school. It will not be like the Christian School Committee that leads our church in the administrative aspects of the school. It is ministry focused. As team leader, Hartley Downs will be recruiting people to help him fulfill the task of the team.

About 100 students enter our building five days a week during the school year. Some of these children are in families that know the Lord and are members of churches in our area. But some of these children are not connected to a church anywhere. We believe that if we love these children, pray for them, minister to their families, and share Christ and the Bible with them, we will be spreading the Gospel and, in part, fulfilling our vision to, "see every life in Jasper transformed by Christ . . ."

Several functions of this ministry team have already started. A Prayer Team has been organized to pray for the special needs of the students, their families, and the school staff. 2nd and 3rd grade students are now attending a weekly Bible class. And this past Wednesday, 12 of our church members welcomed, served, and loved on the parents who attended the school "Pancakes with Parents" breakfast.
